#### **CELL PHONES/DEVICES**

Parents, we need your help. We have seen an increasing problem with cell phones, smart watches, and phone watches in the classroom and at recess. We want to ensure the safety of all students and want to minimize distractions in the classroom. Please take time to review with your child about appropriate device usage. The devices need to be powered off and in backpacks throughout the day. If you need to speak with your child during the school day, please call the office and we can help or encourage your student to speak with their teacher about using the phone. Learning first is always our top priority but these devices can get in the way. We greatly appreciate your help and support in this and for taking the time to speak with your student.

#### RECESS

If you need to give something to your student or speak with them, we ask you to come to the office instead of speaking through the fence or handing things over the fence. This presents a safety concern because often those coming are parents, but on the chance it's a stranger, our recess supervisors do not know and we want to be sure we know who all are to keep our students safe.
