At the heartbreaking announcement to continue the 'Soft Closure' of Utah schools, we strive to remain hopeful and connected during uncertainty. We miss our students! Teachers and staff remain optimistic and committed to providing quality instruction and emotional support to students and families during COVID-19. With this news, Snow Horse Elementary's Remote Learning Plan will be updated to correlate with District mandates and will address the end-of-year closing procedures. The district has requested all communication be sent out to our communities the first week of May. This communication will outline how devices will be returned, grades reported, student yearbooks and personal belonging collection from current classrooms, etc.

Traditionally, curricular activities focus on end-of-level testing preparation and review. In keeping with this scope and sequence, our teachers will be outlining essential skills for May. Our goal is to maximize learning without overwhelming, and with mindful consideration to the results of the *Remote Learning Survey*. We appreciate our parents (49.5%) who took the time to give us valuable feedback. 7% of our families reported that the amount of work provided was too much, with 18% of students not being able to complete the work with minimal help from parents. 78% reported that their child is spending the recommended 2 and 1/2 hours or less to complete assignments. As we reflect on this data and formulate plans for the remaining 5 weeks, we truly appreciate your partnership. Each teacher will continue to monitor participation and offer assistance with flexibility to meet academic expectations on an individual basis. Curriculum instruction will primarily be delivered between the hours of 8:30 am and 1:30 pm.

Our goal is to work with families as we facilitate digital lessons. We know firsthand from the parent perspective all of the hard work that you are doing to support learning. Many of our teachers are working parents, who are also learning to balance teaching with home responsibilities. Please be patient with yourselves and with your students. Their little worlds have been completely changed, along with our everyday routines. Together we can add a little normalcy to their day until we can be together in our classrooms. In the meantime, we can share the moon and find comfort we're all under the same sky; together as Colts.

May you and your families stay healthy, happy and safe.
