Volunteer Agreement

Snow Horse Elementary recognizes the value and importance of volunteers for the educational process. District Policy 10CR-001, Section 2.9 notes that volunteering in an educational setting is not an entitlement. Therefore, individuals may be denied the opportunity to volunteer by either the District or school administration for non-discriminatory reasons.

To ensure volunteers are safe, successful and add value to our programs, the following volunteer agreement outlines additional professional codes of conduct and expectations. Snow Horse elementary strongly recommends a background check for all volunteers to provide maximum security and allow for wider service opportunities.

1.	I have read and understand the Davis School District Policy regarding
	Volunteering, and Background checks. And agree to conform to applicable rules, laws
	as outlined.
2.	FERPA (Family Educational Rights & Privacy Act, 1974) Protects student
	educational records, data, and information. As a volunteer strict confidence relating to
	student academic, behavior performance data must be given. Failure to protect
	student/teacher/employee or school data will result in dismissal of volunteer
	opportunities.
3.	Non-school age students, i.e., younger siblings' toddlers, infants, babies,
٥.	should be kept at home while volunteering.
4.	The school environment must display neutrality towards religion and politics.
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	They are not platforms for personal ideologies. Refrain from discussions with teachers, and
	students on related topics to avoid offense, discourse and/or contention. Promote
	fairness, respect, sensitivity, inclusivity, and a nurturing environment.
5.	I understand and agree to follow the directions of the employee to whom I
	am offering support services.
6.	If injured while volunteering, the District's Worker's compensation medical
	benefits shall be the exclusionary provider.
7.	Volunteers must use facilities and equipment in a manner that protects the
	resources and property of the school and District.
8.	Volunteer services and time are non-compensable.
9.	Comply with the Utah Ethics Act and refrain from using one's position for
	personal gain, including personal investments, excessive gifts, etc. which could create a
	conflict of interest.
10.	Volunteers must represent the highest standards and values of the
	community.
